Record-Breaking Snowstorm Paralyzes the Great Lakes: Ohio Hit Hard

A record-breaking snowstorm hit the United States on Thanksgiving Day 2024, severely impacting the Great Lakes region. In Ohio, the city of Saybrook reported a record 124 cm (49 inches) of snow, paralyzing transportation and causing numerous accidents.

The heavy snowfall created chaos on the roads:


- Highways I-90 and I-86 in Pennsylvania and New York were closed.
- Over 100 vehicles were evacuated from Route 5 near Dunkirk to clear the roadway.
 - In Ohio, the snow caused mass accidents, especially east of Cleveland.
- Authorities in New York banned commercial transport on some sections of I-90 and temporarily closed westbound lanes of the highway.

The "lake-effect" snowfall also brought heavy accumulation to New York and Michigan. Despite emergency declarations and assistance from first responders, the situation remains unstable. Snowfall is expected to continue through December 4, further complicating infrastructure recovery.
