"SISTER CITIES: CLEVELAND, OHIO AND VOLGOGRAD, RUSSIA – SINCE 1990!"

Cleveland has 28 sister cities — quite a significant number, especially compared to larger U.S. cities. These partnerships carry considerable historical, economic, and political importance.

In 1985, residents of Shaker Heights and Cleveland Heights successfully established a partnership with the Soviet city of Volzhsky, and soon after, Clevelanders began pursuing a similar collaboration with Volgograd. Although initially rejected in 1989, the agreement was officially formalized in 1990. Such partnerships helped ease tensions between the USA and the USSR and promoted the spread of Russian culture.

Economic cooperation also benefited both sides — supporting the USSR's economic goals while bolstering Cleveland-based companies. The success of the Volgograd partnership inspired Cleveland to further expand its international ties.


Since 1990, I have visited Volgograd and Volzhsky 19 times and organized numerous delegations with the support of the Council for International Programs USA (CIPUSA). During the COVID-19 pandemic, we held monthly ZOOM meetings with over 100 students from the USA (Cleveland) and the Volgograd region, as well as Arkhangelsk. This led to the formation of the "4 Cities for Peace" coalition, uniting Portland (Maine), Arkhangelsk, Cleveland, and Volgograd.

This year marks the 35th anniversary of the Cleveland-Volgograd partnership, as well as the 80th anniversary of the Meeting on the Elbe on April 25, 1945, when Soviet and American troops joined forces at the Elbe River, effectively splitting Germany and hastening the end of World War II in Europe.

## DID YOU KNOW?



Interesting Traditions and Celebrations in April:



#### Folk Omens of April:

- If April 1st is warm, the summer will be hot.
- A rainy April means a good harvest.
- "April with water, May with grass"
   the more meltwater, the better the harvest of grasses and cereals.

#### Cosmonautics Day (April 12th):

This day is dedicated to the first human spaceflight – Yuri Gagarin, who orbited the Earth on April 12, 1961, aboard the spacecraft "Vostok 1." The day is marked by themed events, exhibitions, and screenings of films about space around the world. We would like to remind you that in Cleveland, in the Russian Cultural Garden, there is a bust of Yuri Gagarin. The monument was unveiled on August 25, 2019.

### Yegoryev Day (April 23rd):

On this day, Saint George the Victorious, the patron saint of warriors and farmers, was honored. He was also considered the protector of livestock, so in villages, rituals were held to protect horses and cows, often involving the first drive of the animals to pasture after the winter.

## Opening of the Land (Late April):

In the villages, they would say: "The earth is waking up, it's time to plow!" It was believed that the first work in the field should begin with a prayer, otherwise, the harvest would not be plentiful.
