Dear friends and residents of our city!



WINTER OLYMPICS 2026



From February 6 to 22, 2026, the world will once again hold its breath – the XXV Winter Olympic Games, known as Milano Cortina 2026, will take place in Italy. This is an event eagerly awaited by athletes and fans from all over the world!

WHERE AND WHEN?

For the first time in history, the Olympics will officially be held in two host cities – the famous fashion capital Milan and the legendary winter resort Cortina d'Ampezzo, in the Lombardy and Veneto regions of northern Italy.

Opening ceremony: February 6, 2026

Closing ceremony: February 22, 2026

The Games will feature over 15 winter sports, ranging from classic alpine skiing to thrilling hockey and figure skating.

THE ORIGINS OF MASLENITSA: A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE FESTIVAL

Maslenitsa is one of the **oldest holidays** of the Eastern Slavs. Its origins date back to the 1st millennium AD, when agricultural tribes celebrated the farewell to winter and the arrival of spring. The festival was closely connected with the cult of the sun and fertility, and its main symbols became the sun and pancakes. The round, golden pancake symbolized **warmth, life, and abundance**. By baking pancakes, people symbolically “invited” the sun and prepared for a new agricultural year.

Originally, Maslenitsa was celebrated around the spring equinox (approximately March 20-22). However, after the **Christianization of Rus' in 988**, the holiday was incorporated into the church calendar as the last week before Great Lent. Folk festivities, sleigh rides, games, and feasting were preserved, but they acquired a new spiritual meaning – **forgiveness, reconciliation, and inner renewal**.



Thus, Maslenitsa has traveled a long path of more than a thousand years, preserving both its pagan roots and Christian traditions. Today, pancakes remain its main symbol: round, warm, and golden, they remind us of sunlight, **the warmth of the family hearth, and the joy of celebrating together**.

This year, due to the cold and unpredictable weather, Maslenitsa will not take place, but very soon we invite everyone to join the big summer celebration – Iuan Kupala!



Surprising Facts About Valentine's Day:



The History of Saint Valentine:

Saint Valentine, a Roman priest of the 3rd century, secretly united lovers in marriage despite Emperor Claudius II's ban. Believing that unmarried men made better soldiers, the emperor had him arrested. Valentine was executed on **February 14, 269**, and has since become a lasting symbol of love and fidelity.

The Earliest Valentine's Cards:

The first love letters in Europe appeared during the **14th and 15th centuries**. The oldest surviving Valentine, from **1415**, was written by Charles, Duke of Orléans, to his wife while he was imprisoned, signed simply, "From your Valentine."

Symbols and Traditions:

The heart as a symbol of love didn't appear until the **14th century**, and Cupid, borrowed from Roman mythology, became the iconic god of love with his bow and arrows. The practice of giving **flowers**, **chocolates**, and **plush toys** emerged in the 19th century, as Valentine's Day grew into a mass celebration.

Interesting Numbers:

Every year in the U.S., schoolchildren send around 145 million valentines, and over 36 million boxes of chocolate are sold for Valentine's Day. In both the U.K. and the U.S., valentines rank second in popularity, just after Christmas cards.
