

The holiday of pancakes:

The main symbol of Maslenitsa is pancakes. They symbolize the sun because of their round shape and golden color. In ancient times, it was believed that by eating pancakes, people would absorb a piece of the sun's energy.

Maslenitsa dolls:

In some regions, small effigy dolls were kept in the home as charms until the next Maslenitsa.

The holiday for animals:

In rural tradition, during
Maslenitsa, cows and horses
were given extra treats: hay with
honey or pancakes. It was
believed that this would bring a
bountiful harvest and good
health to the animals.

The holiday unites:

Maslenitsa was not only a family holiday, but also a time of reconciliation. People visited each other, asked for forgiveness, and strengthened their relationships.
