

VOICES OF THE RUSSIAN GARDEN



Over time, we settled in, started working, made friends, and became part of American life. Our daughters were born here. All of my free time outside of work has always gone (and still goes) to our home, our family, our children-and now our grandchildren. At the same time, I've always been deeply interested in the history of our country and our city. I love exploring new places, learning their stories, and visiting local landmarks. I enjoy reading, spending time with my extended family and friends, and staying active. I've even learned to ski-my favorite winter activity. In summer, I love swimming in the lake and kayaking down the rivers. I adore our theaters and museums-they are truly world-class. There's so much to see and do... the only problem is that there's never enough time.

We came to the U.S. through a family reunification program, thanks to the Jewish community of our hometown. My family and I will always be grateful for that. We are still active members of the community, take part in its life, and donate to support its needs. We've also made an effort to connect with the Ukrainian community–after all, we were born in Ukraine, spent the formative years of our lives there, and it is our homeland. My husband is half Ukrainian. Today, during these tragic times for Ukraine, I try to support and participate in events organized by the local Ukrainian community to help the country.

When we first arrived in Cleveland, one of the first local landmarks we were told about was the Cultural Gardens. When I visited them and wandered through the different gardens, I was disappointed to find that there was no Russian Cultural Garden. "Well," I thought, "it is what it is." Still, I felt a little sad.

That's why, when in 2012 (or maybe earlier–I can't remember how or from whom) I learned that there were wonderful people like Boris Vinogradsky and Svetlana Stolyarova, who had managed to raise enough funds to create the Russian Cultural Garden, I immediately wanted to get involved. When I came to my very first volunteer clean-up day, I met people of many nationalities from various former Soviet republics. What united everyone was the shared desire to create a garden that would reflect the culture we were raised in–the language we speak with our children and with each other.

The atmosphere was incredibly kind and joyful. I immediately felt something I had been missing since leaving Odesa: a **sense of belonging.** I realized that I had found what I had been looking for all those years.

Many years have passed since then, and much has changed. The Garden slowly took shape, new volunteers came and helped however they could. Over the years, we've held many events in the Garden, open to everyone. And the warm, welcoming spirit has never gone away-it's always stayed the same. More recently, the leadership of the Garden changed. Kristina Makhneva and Mikhail Khoretonenko took it into their very capable hands, revitalized its activity, and brought it to a new level.

It makes me so happy to see that more and more people are becoming part of the Garden. Many young families with children have joined. The Garden and its events are becoming more and more popular.

New Year's celebrations, Maslenitsa, Children's Day, outdoor movies and concerts-all these events are drawing more and more people. Each event is a real celebration-for both visitors and volunteers. The feeling I experienced on my first day in the Garden-that sense of belonging-has stayed with me to this day. And that is the most important thing. I treasure it deeply.






Dear Clevelanders!


