REMEMBRANCE, UNITY, AND CARE: A DAY OF COMMUNITY CLEAN-UP AND NEW MEMORIALS IN THE RUSSIAN GARDEN

On April 20, 2025, two significant events took place in the Russian Garden — the traditional community clean-up day and a solemn ceremony to unveil new memorial stones honoring prominent figures in culture, the arts, and spiritual life.

The highlight of the day was the unveiling of a new commemorative stone dedicated to writer Mikhail Zhvanetsky (1934–2020). The initiative to replace the old stone, which had been installed during the satirist's lifetime, came from sponsor Konstantin Pavolotsky. He personally attended the ceremony and played a key role in organizing the event.











On the same day, memorial stones were also installed in honor of the following distinguished individuals:

- Nikolai Sokolov (1886–1965) Composer
- Dmitry Muratov Nobel Peace Prize Laureate (2021)
- Savely Kramarov (1934–1995) Actor
- Andrei Rublev (1360s 1427/1430) Icon
 Painter
- Sergius of Radonezh (1314–1392) Spiritual Leader
- Alexey N. Tolstoy (1883–1945) Writer

The community clean-up was a success: the garden was thoroughly tidied and is now ready for upcoming events. The day unfolded in a warm and solemn atmosphere, bringing together guests and volunteers who paid their respects to the great individuals who left a lasting mark on history and culture.

DID YOU KNOW?



The significance of the month of May in Russian culture:



May as a symbol of youth and love:

In Russian poetry and prose, May often symbolizes the beginning of life, passion, and romance. For example, in Alexander Blok's poem "Oh, Spring Without End or Boundaries" (1907), spring, including May, is a time of dreams and hopes. Turgenev's prose, such as "First Love," is also infused with the May atmosphere of blooming and first emotions.

Theater and spring performances:

In Russian theatrical tradition, May is associated with the end of the season and premieres of light, spring plays. For example, plays by Chekhov, such as The Cherry Orchard (where the blooming of cherries is a key image), were often staged during this time, highlighting the connection between May, beauty, and loss.

May in folklore and fairy tales:

In Russian fairy tales and beliefs, May is a time when nature "speaks": the bird cherry blossoms, and forest spirits (such as the Leshy and the Mermaid) come to life. This adds a mystical quality to the month, especially in rural culture, where May was considered a transitional time between spring and summer.

Literature May:

Many Russian writers and poets, whose names are closely linked to culture, were born in May: Mikhail Bulgakov (May 15), Joseph Brodsky (May 24), Anna Akhmatova (May 23, according to the old calendar). Their works can be recalled as part of the May inspiration.
