MESSAGE FROM SVETLANA STOLYAROVA

FOUNDER OF RCG

Dear Friends!

If one is to visit Cleveland, it should be in September. The sunny grace of late summer, the festivals, the street concerts—all of this creates the atmosphere of a vibrant, welcoming city. The activists and volunteers of the Russian Cultural Garden have made a significant contribution to shaping this atmosphere. We are proud to have taken part in organizing a remarkable event—the debut concert of the magnificent Russian pianist Polina Osetinskaya, which took place on September 12th at Severance Hall.

Cleveland audiences are accustomed to the greatest names, and musicians consider it an honor to perform before Clevelanders, who have earned the reputation of being an educated, refined, sensitive, and highly discerning public. Polina Osetinskaya was nervous before her concert in Severance Hall's Grand Hall, and with reason: although well known in Russia, Europe, Latin America, and Asia, she had only performed in major U.S. venues such as Carnegie Hall alongside violinist Maxim Vengerov, while her solo concerts had been held in the intimate settings of smaller halls. The main source of her anxiety—and at the same time, the greatest gift to the Cleveland audience—was the very demanding, carefully designed, and meticulously staged program she brought to Cleveland. To perform five works by Bach as a single piece, holding the audience's attention for fifty minutes, is an achievement in itself. And how sensitively, with tears of cleansing and gratitude, the audience received this "unprecedented Bach marathon," as one attendee called it.

By including in her program technically formidable works by Tchaikovsky, the pianist not only displayed astonishing virtuosity but also paid homage to the great Russian musical tradition, for which we are deeply grateful to the wonderful Polina Osetinskaya. Her performance was met with a standing ovation, flowers, and three encores—something even the seasoned staff of the Hall remarked upon: "We have welcomed the greatest virtuosos of the world at Severance, but three encores—that is truly extraordinary, even for our Hall." The concert also received glowing reviews from the city's music critics.

I believe that the city's residents and the representatives of the Russian-speaking community will continue to support our future initiatives in bringing the finest musicians of the Russian school to Cleveland audiences. Upcoming plans include a concert by Vadim Repin, musical-literary evenings at the Museum of Art, and concerts by young performers. After all, the mission of the Russian Cultural Garden is to promote Russian culture and present its finest achievements to the people of the United States.
